**MOSAIC** Mission Camp is sponsored by Long Beach United Methodist Church. It was started in 2006 in response to the great need on the Gulf Coast due to Hurricane Katrina. Our goal is to reach out to the people of Long Beach and surrounding communities with the love of Jesus Christ. We want to help those that are less fortunate by repairing their homes and helping them to have a better standard of living, but we also want to share Jesus with them. We want to give teenagers the opportunity to serve selflessly and share their faith with others. Along with working at different sites during the day, we will eat together at breakfast and dinner, and have nightly worship services with guest speakers and music. There will be opportunities for students to participate in different activities and get to know each other a little better. Housing will be provided at the church. We are limited by space, so showers may be somewhat primitive. As a community we are still in long-term recovery from Hurricane Katrina but the focus of our service is now driven only by the present needs. In other words our work projects will be for those who have need whether it be Katrina related or not. Our hope is that by serving together in this week and in this community students will be inspired and driven to make a difference in their own communities.

## EXPECTATIONS

- [1] One adult leader must participate with each group of 5 youth. If there are less than five youth from your church, you must still send one adult with them.
- [2] Youth campers include students entering 7th grade through graduating seniors.
- [3] Each adult leader must bring a van, truck or SUV that seats at least 5 for transportation of your work team and materials.
- [4] Adult leader must be at least 19 years old.
- [5] Adult leaders must participate for the entire week and must be there to work for the full six hours daily.
- [6] Adult leaders must be present for the evening worship services.
- [7] No special menus will be provided
- [8] Vehicles must remain parked and not leave the premises except to travel to and from the work site.
- [9] Other rules will be provided the first day of the camp.
